## I. ABOUT THIS CODEBOOK

This codebook contains the names and coding for questions asked in Round 3 (July-September 2017) of *Access to Durable Solutions Among IDPs in Iraq* and corresponds to all variables in the PANELFILE with the appendage “3”. For information on variable name conventions, missingness, weights, and other survey design-related questions, please see the *Access to Durable Solutions Among Iraqi IDPs: Quantitative Methodology Report*.

## II. NOTES ABOUT ROUND 3

As stated in the *Quantitative Methodology Report*, unless otherwise specified, missing data are denoted in one of two ways. Responses were coded -88 if the question was not applicable, and responses were coded -99 if the respondent did not know or refused to answer the question. Users should also consult the *Quantitative Methodology Report* for the research team’s recommendations on the use of the included weight variable (**weight3**).

As in Round 2, some households in the study continued to move in Round 3: some returning to their districts of origin; some moved to other governorates inside Iraq. The study-defined variable denoting this status (IDP, Mover, Returnee) in Round 3 is **status3**. Definitions of each of these groups are as follows:

- **IDPs:** households displaced to one district in Round 1 and who remained in the same location throughout displacement
- **Movers:** households displaced to one district in Round 1 but who moved to another district subsequently
- **Returnees:** households displaced in Round 1 but who returned to their districts of origin in subsequent rounds.

Some questions were thus tailored to a certain subgroup. Where all groups were asked the same questions, the responses are combined into one variable with no appendage. Where questions were asked only of IDPs/Movers or only of Returnees, the variable name contains the appendage **IDP** for IDPs/Movers and **RT** for Returnees.

Furthermore, while the study attempted to maintain the question number, question structure, and response categories as much as possible over the multiple rounds of the study, users are advised that in some cases, the number, structure, or response categories for the same question text did vary over time. This codebook provides notes alerting users to this fact whenever possible.
